# **RALLYING CRY** FOR FIRMS TO HELP REBUILD

The West Midlands will lead a green industrial revolution to make Britain stronger after the coronavirus has been defeated, the Tory Party chair has said.

Amanda Milling said Covid-19 had put into "sharp focus" the need to rebuild, with the region to take centre stage in plans for a push into cleaner energy.

She said Boris Johnson's levelling up agenda was "very much on course" and that an accelerated programme of house building and job creation would spark

life into the West Midlands economy. The Cannock Chase MP opened the Conservative Party conference with a commitment to back voters who had turned to the Tories in the general election.

Speaking after the Prime Minister announced plans to repair Britain's economy through clean energy and wind powered homes, she told the Express & Star: "This pandemic has really put into sharp focus the need to rebuild. And we are going to need to accelerate that in order to recover

## Accused denies killing of man knifed to death

A 20-year-old man has pleaded not guilty to the murder of Paulius Petrasiunas in Wolverhampton.

Sean Bulle appeared at Wolverhampton Crown Court over the death of Mr Petrasiunas, aged 24, who was stabbed to death outside a block of flats in Chervil Rise, Heath Town, on July 13.

Bulle, of Clover Ley, Heath Town, was remanded in custody ahead of a further hearing on January 8.

#### Jury is sworn in as Julia Hunt on for EuroMillions murder trial due to start winner to claim jackpot

Jurors have been sworn in ahead of a trial over the murder of a former market stallholder.

Nathan Maynard-Ellis, 29, of Mission Drive, Tipton, and David Leesley, 24, of Dereton Close, Dudley, both deny killing Julia Rawson. Her remains were discovered in Tipton on June 12 last year - one month after she was last seen alive on May 12. Ms Rawson was a former stallholder at Dudley Market.
